Brief description of program or funding including funding distribution method (formula or competitive grant): \$650,000,000 shall be provided to HHS to carry out evidence-based clinical and community-based prevention and wellness strategies authorized by the Public Health Service Act, as determined by the Secretary, that deliver specific, measurable health outcomes that address chronic disease rates. However, these funds may be transferred to other appropriation accounts of the Department of Health and Human Services, as determined by the Secretary.

According to the CDC Senior Management Official, 80% will be distributed using a population-based formula and will be non-competitive. The remaining 20% will be focused on children and will be competitive. There is conflicting information about whether the funding will go to the state or directly to communities.

When funds are expected to be available: Although there has been no formal announcement, we have expect the funds to be available within the next three to six months.

How long are funds available: Approximately two years.

Conditions or prerequisites for accessing funds (include matching or MOE requirements):
Unknown

Federal agency: The traditional funding source for these efforts is the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention however, the Secretary of HHS could move the funds to other areas of the department.

State agency: DOH, Family Health Services, Bureau of Chronic Disease Prevention and Health Promotion
